Public Statement of Liquid Fuels Company of Trinidad and Tobago Limited

In Compliance with sections 7, 8 and 9 of
The Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Chapter 22:02

(UPDATE IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTIONS 7(1) (b), 8(2) (b) & 9(2) (b) OF THE FOIA)

In accordance with Sections 7 (1) (b), 8 (2) (b) and 9 (2) (b) of the Freedom of Information Act Chapter 22:02 (FOIA), the Liquid Fuels Company of Trinidad and Tobago Limited (LFCTT) is required by law to publish updated statements that list the documents and information generally available to the public.

The FOIA gives members of the public:

1. A legal right for each person to access information held by LFCTT.
2. A legal right for each person to have official information relating to himself/herself amended where it is incomplete, incorrect or misleading.
3. A legal right to obtain reasons for adverse decisions made regarding an applicant's request for information under the FOIA.
4. A legal right to complain to the Ombudsman and to apply to the High Court for Judicial Review to challenge adverse decisions made under the FOIA.

Liquid Fuels Company of Trinidad and Tobago Limited (LFCTT) publishes the following statement as approved by the Minister of Energy and Energy Industries:

Section 7 Statements

Section 7 (1) (a) (i)

Function and structure of the Liquid Fuels Company of Trinidad and Tobago Limited

LFCTT was incorporated on 03 July 2015 as a subsidiary of the Petroleum Company of Trinidad and Tobago Limited (PETROTRIN) to own and operate the fuelling terminal facility at Caroni. Pursuant to a decision of the Cabinet of the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago, Trinidad & Tobago National Petroleum Marketing Company Limited (NP) acquired the ownership of LFCTT, which commenced operations as a wholly owned subsidiary of NP on 13 November 2017.

LFCTT holds a Strategic Vision to become the safest and most efficient Terminal operator for the distribution of liquid fuels in Trinidad.

The portfolio of LFCTT encompasses the following:

1. Operate the facilities created from the completed Liquid Fuels Pipeline and Ancillary Facilities project and distribute liquid fuels on behalf of Paria Fuel Trading Company Limited (Paria) to their fuel wholesale customers.
2. Provide fuel security to the citizens of Trinidad and Tobago by providing a facility designed to hold a seven (7) day reserve of motor fuels and a ten (10) day reserve for Jet A1 fuel.
3. Provide safer, more reliable and more efficient storage and transfer of liquid petroleum fuels.

Approved Structure - Major Responsibility Centers and its sub divisions are:

- Management
- Finance and Accounting
- Engineering and Maintenance
- Operations and Laboratory
- Fuel Logistics
- Security
- Administration

There are a number of Committees that are operational. Where applicable, these Committees comprise of officers of LFCTT. These Committees are as follows:

- HSSE Committee
- Tender Preparation and Review Committee
- Supervisory and Leadership Committee

LFCTT's registered office is located at NP House, National Drive, Sea Lots, Port-of-Spain.

The Board of Directors of LFCTT is appointed by NP and controls the overall direction of the Company.

There are forty-eight (48) positions on LFCTT's approved Organisation Structure, of which thirty-two (32) positions are filled at this time. The workforce is headed by the Liquid Fuels Company of Trinidad and Tobago Manager. LFCTT's approved Organisation Structure consists of seven (7) major responsibility centers along with other support, monitoring and executive functions under the Liquid Fuels Company of Trinidad and Tobago Manager. As of July 2023, there are twenty (20) Permanent employees, eleven (11) Contract employees, inclusive of the Manager, and one (1) employee seconded from fellow subsidiary company, Natpet Investments Company Limited. There are also two (2) Engineering Assistants who are On-the-Job Trainees (OJTs) and who do not fill any of the permanent positions at this time.

Section 7 (1) (a) (v)

Procedure to be followed when accessing a document from LFCTT

LFCTT's policy is to answer all requests, both oral and written, for information. However, in order to have the rights given to you by the FOIA (for example the right to challenge a decision if your request for information is refused), **you must make your request in writing**. The following procedure should be followed when making a request:

How to request Information:

1. General Procedure

Applicants may obtain an FOIA application form (*Request for Access to Official Documents*) from the Government FOIA Unit on its website address: www.foia.gov.tt in order to access information that is not readily available to the public.

2. Addressing Requests

To facilitate prompt handling of your request, please address it to the Designated Officer of the Company (see Section 7 (1) (a) (vi)).

3. Details in the Request

Applicants should provide details that will allow for ready identification and location of the records that are being requested. If insufficient information is provided clarification will be sought from the applicant. If you are not sure how to write your request or what details to include, please communicate with the Designated Officer (as named in section 7 (1) (a) (vi)).

4. Requests not handled under the FOIA

A request under the FOIA will not be processed to the extent that it asks for information which is readily available to the public.

5. Furnishing Documents

Copies of documents are only furnished when they are in our possession, custody or power. Prior to the commencement of the Freedom of Information Act Chapter 22:02, old records may have been destroyed. The granting of a request for such documents may therefore be impossible. Various laws, regulations and manuals give the time periods for keeping records before they may be destroyed, for example, The Exchequer and Audit Act, Chapter 69:01. If we cannot make a legible copy of a document to be released, we may not attempt to reconstruct it. Instead, we will furnish the best copy possible and note its quality in our reply. Please note we are not compelled to do the following:

- a. Create new documents. For example, we are not required to write a new program so that a computer will print information in the format you prefer.
- b. Perform research for you.

A request is deemed to be received when the original of the completed request form is received by the Designated Officer or the Company Secretary, and a written acknowledgement is issued.

6. Time Limits

General

The FOIA sets a time limit of thirty (30) calendar days from the date the request was received for determination of your request for access to documents. If we fail to meet this deadline, the FOIA gives you the right to proceed as though your request has been denied. We will try diligently to comply with the time limit. If it appears that processing your request may take longer than the statutory limit, we will advise you of its status.

Upon any consultation between the applicant and the Designated Officer, time is suspended in the computation of the thirty-day period (Sec. 21(7)).

Time Allowed

We will determine whether to grant your request for access to information as soon as practicable but no later than thirty (30) calendar days from the date the request was received as required by Section 15 of the FOIA. If a decision is taken to grant access to the information requested, you will be permitted to inspect the documents and/or be provided with copies. In the event of refusal of access, you will be notified by the Designated Officer, in writing, of the reason/s for refusal.

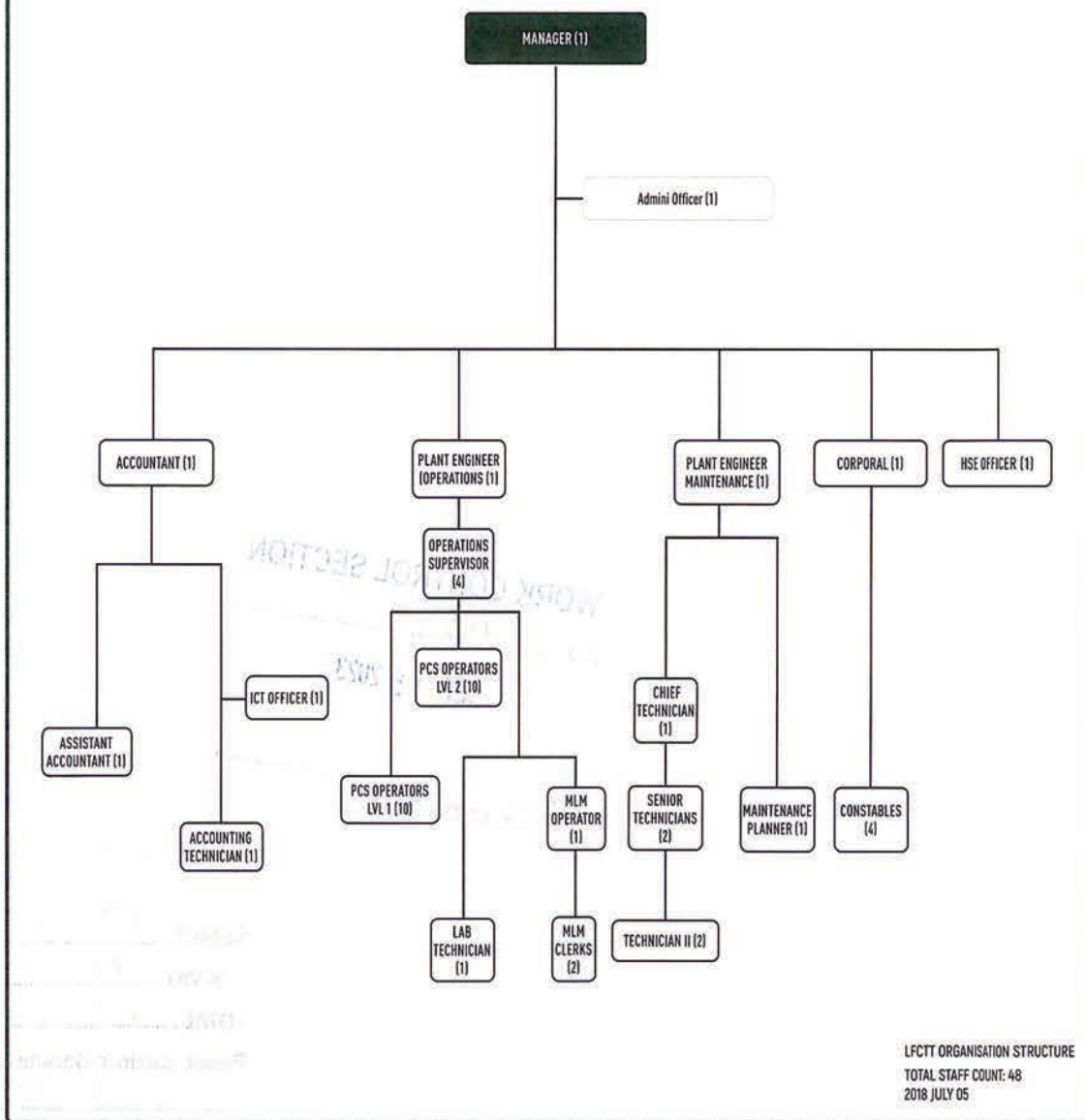

Note 1

These financial highlights are prepared in accordance with criteria developed by management using information derived from the audited financial statements of Trinidad Generation Unlimited for the year ended 31 December 2022. These audited financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards and can be found on the Company's website or the website of the Singapore Stock Exchange.

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

Trinidad Generation Unlimited (TGU) owns, operates, and maintains a fuel-efficient 720-megawatt (MW) capacity combined-cycle gas-fired power plant located in the Union Industrial Estate, Vessigny, La Brea. The Company, initially a joint project of the AES Corporation and the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago (GORTT), is currently wholly owned by the GORTT through 100% ownership of its National Investment Fund Holding Company Limited (NIFHCL). NIFHCL has been set up to hold its investment in TGU together with its holdings of other publicly traded assets listed with the Trinidad and Tobago Stock Exchange.

During the year ended 31 December 2022, the power plant experienced a shortfall in Equivalent Availability (EA) compared to the target. This was primarily due to unscheduled maintenance on its gas turbines to maintain asset integrity. Repairs were successfully performed, and the related generators and steam cycle were brought back online. In response to this challenge, we conducted a strategic analysis and implemented strong contingency measures to prevent the reoccurrence of unscheduled maintenance activities and support the delivery of planned EAs in the future. TGU remains focused on asset integrity, reliability, and maintaining high standards of Health, Safety, and Environmental (HSE) practices. We have embedded HSE values into our culture and daily operations, resulting in the achievement of our HSE targets for the year ended 31 December 2022.

Financially, TGU achieved a profit before tax of US\$8 million for the year ended 31 December 2022, while incurring a loss of US\$6 million after tax. This reflects a decrease compared to the profit before tax of US\$26 million and profit after tax of US\$18 million achieved in 2021. The lower profitability in 2022 can be attributed to the lower EA compared to the previous year. Total assets as at 31 December 2022 amounted to US\$1.087 billion, representing a decrease of US\$9 million for the financial year. Similarly, total equity as at 31 December 2022 amounted to US\$247 million, reflecting a decrease of US\$15 million compared to equity as at 31 December 2021.

In November 2016, TGU issued its US\$600 million 144A/RegS bond in the international capital markets at a rate of 5.25%. The bond has continued to trade above par on both the 144A and Reg S international markets. As at 31 December 2022, the remaining life of TGU's bond was five (5) years, and the Company had successfully paid US\$189 million of interest to its bondholders. The international ratings as at 31 December 2022 reflect TGU's position as a sovereign-linked entity and its significance to Trinidad and Tobago's energy matrix and operational integration with the ultimate parent.

TGU recognises its role in the financial market and its responsibilities as a wholly owned subsidiary of NIFHCL and an issuer of a United States Dollar (USD) denominated international bond.

Amid the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, TGU prioritised antigen testing and mask wearing as primary control measures within the organisation in 2022. Throughout the year, contact tracing and testing were conducted for primary contacts under the advice of TGU's physicians, and the company implemented active sanitisation and COVID-19 prevention measures. As of December 31, 2022, vaccination statistics indicated a 91% vaccinated status for TGU employees. Antigen testing was regularly conducted for Maintenance, Operations, and Warehouse personnel, as well as contractors, with more frequent testing during outage works. In December 2022, based on TGU's internal Risk Assessment, National Guidelines, and in consultation with TGU's Occupational Doctors, the decision was made to cease antigen testing, and wearing face masks became voluntary as of January 1st, 2023.

Furthermore, TGU remained committed to its Strategic Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Objectives and Initiatives, supporting both the fence line and national communities through various training and educational programmes throughout the year. These initiatives were tailored to address the specific socio-economic needs of the communities and stakeholders involved and received positive reviews. TGU employees demonstrated their commitment to volunteerism by actively supporting the implementation of the company's CSR initiatives within both the fence line and national communities.

Despite the challenges faced in 2022, TGU maintained a strong focus on strategic objectives, ensuring the safety of its people and plant, and fulfilling its commitments to shareholders and stakeholders. The adaptability of the company allowed us to foster a remote work culture while maintaining core operations and enhancing governance through the development of strategic policies and procedures.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to our valued customer, Trinidad and Tobago Electricity Commission (T&TEC), the NIFHCL, our company Directors, our dedicated employees, and all other stakeholders for their invaluable contributions to the continued growth and sustainability of Trinidad Generation Unlimited.
