THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION)  
(NO. 2) ORDER, 2025

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) (No. 2) Order, 2025. Citation

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule, being a Commonwealth citizen admitted to practise law in England and Wales for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule. Mr. Simon Christopher Peter Knox, K.C.	Of the Honourable Society of Middle Temple: Barrister, admitted to practise at the Bar of England and Wales in November, 1983 and was appointed King's Counsel in 2006.
