THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION) (NO. 2) ORDER, 2025

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for _{Citation} Admission) (No. 2) Order, 2025.

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule, being a Commonwealth Eligibility for citizen admitted to practise law in England and Wales for not less than admission to practise ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule.
